Hendricks – The VA was contacted. and they requested lap blankets for the VA hospital. Members developed a fleece prototype which was a full body blanket with a muff pocket on the front. Members gathered with their sewing machines for a sewing day and then continued making the blankets from home. The group also donated a variety of other items to the VA clients. **Vigo County** - Donated more than twenty boxes of clothing, personal hygiene items, baby items, cleaning supplies, school supplies, and diapers to CODA -Council on Domestic Abuse. Johnson – Kic-it (Kids in Crisis Intervention Team) serves homeless children in Johnson County. Collected items and put together 20 grooming kits including a monetary gift. On their Local membership form, they added a line for people to donate directly to Kic-it when they pay their dues. Grant – Chose to help the Salvation Army as their project. Some were bell ringers. Also donated food items and gave monetary donations. The Angel Tree (gifts for children only) was encouraged on an individual basis. Bartholomew County-They decided to help two school corporations by promoting a clothing drive. Nurses in the schools need clothing for students. Also encouraged monetary donation to supplement other purchases needed. Hancock County - Supported the Andis Women's Clinic to provide screening health

services for all women with an emphasis on those women who are at risk and uninsured or underinsured.

Whitewater Valley – Helped those students who have decided to make education a career. To do this members collected gently used shoes which went to Africa, South America and the Philippines. After collecting 3,000 shoes they were able to use the money to award their first scholarship.

**Daviess-Martin** – "Pennies from Heaven" -- Monetary donations collected and presented to two libraries' summer reading programs. Another donation was given to Camp Illiana plus an additional donation of cleaning supplies to aid the camp in their mission.
