

From the Desk of the Executive Director

I think we consider too much the good luck of the early bird and not enough the bad luck of the early worm. - Franklin D. Roosevelt. Spring is here, and as I am writing this, we still do not know the final budget vote for the biennium, but we know the path HB 1028 for a "13th check" has followed. Unlike April, 2021, when I became IRTA Executive Director only a few weeks before the final vote for a pension enhancement, I have been at the "helm" of IRTA to watch every step of the 2023 Legislative Session.

Here is a review of what has happened so far. HB 1028 for a "13th check" was authored by Rep. Bob Cherry with co-authors Rep. Mike Karickhoff, Rep. Gregory Porter, and Rep. Jennifer Meltzer. The bill was heard and passed in the Employment, Labor and Pensions House Committee and the Wavs and Means House Committee. The bill passed in the House by a vote of 96-0. Senator Jon Ford, Sen. Ryan Mishler, and Sen. David Niezgodski agreed to sponsor HB 1028 as it moved to the Senate. Although I continue to share that "I am not a politician, but an educator at heart when I meet with our legislators," I truly enjoy my work on behalf of retired educators at the Indiana Statehouse!

When I thought about what I would focus on for the Spring, 2023, Bulletin Board, I was thinking about the current Legislative Session. I started looking at famous quotes referencing government, politics, and the importance of people

advocating for themselves! There were many to choose from, but the simple quote by FDR I included with this article speaks to what I was looking for. Everyone has a different point of view based on what is happening around them - at times we are the bird and at times we are the worm!

Looking back to the 2021 Budget Session, legislators felt they were doing a positive thing for retired educators when they voted for a 1% Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA). One percent did not seem like very much, but the Legislature had to add an additional \$50 million to the fund that is dedicated to retirement benefits just to get to the one percent.

For 2023 and 2024, the message of IRTA has been strong. We want a "13th check" for our members! The amount of a "13th check" payment is based on your creditable service - up to \$450 and is added to retiree pension amounts in the month of September. As IRTA Executive Director, my point of view has been influenced by the hundreds of conversations I have had with members over the last two years. I am constantly reminded that IRTA represents a very diverse group of over 60,000 retired educators - teachers and administrators. There are those recently retired, like me - and those in their late 70s, 80s and 90s. It is for our older retirees that we currently advocate for a "13th check." We have members with teacher pensions between \$500 - \$1,000 or less per month. The "13th check" means more to these retirees than the 1% COLA did. Based on data compiled by Alberts Actuarial Consulting, LLC in May 2020, here are the number of retired educators with average pensions less than \$1,000 per month:

According to the Senate Majority Fiscal Office, the average "13th check" is \$398.00. Assuming a 13th check is issued every year, 97.6% of 60,539 retired teachers derive more financial benefit from the "13th check."

Over the years, our Indiana Legislators have worked hard to pay off the unfunded liability of the Pre-'96 Fund (for those who were hired before 1996 and remained in the same school corporation). The billions of dollars that Indiana legislators are currently paying toward the Pre-'96 pension debt is the reason our pensions are strong and stable! Today, we are asking for a "13th check." As the demographics of our members change, our discussions with legislators will change.

I ask that you continue to support IRTA. With your membership and support, IRTA will still be going strong advocating for all retired educators at the Indiana Statehouse for years to come!

- IRTA has hosted two virtual workshops. These are aimed at sharing information with our out of state members and those who do not want or are unable to attend "in person" events.
- IRTA is constantly exploring ways to be more visible on social media, as we know this is needed to connect with prospective members to share the benefits of our organization.

Another way to reach out is hosting a Retirement Planning Workshop in your area. I remember when I was considering retirement, I attended such a workshop in Wabash Co. That was the first time I had heard of IRTA. I appreciated the information I received regarding retirement, as well as what IRTA would do in the future to assist me. I know several counties are hosting these workshops, and I hope more local RTAs will serve as hosts. The most important way to reach out, of course, is personal contact. A phone call or personal note to new retirees or prospective members can make all the difference. We know how it affects us on deciding whether we will attend an event. Once you get them to your local meeting, tell them about IRTA and give them a membership form.

We all need to work together to promote IRTA. Whether it is helping with a project such a Retirement Planning Workshop or just asking someone to join IRTA. Share the news about IRTA and its mission to advocate for retired educators and provide benefits to our members.

The Strategic Planning and Retirement Planning committees have been working on ways to assist our local RTAs in hosting Retirement Planning Workshops. This involved several parts. First, we have been working on updating the Retirement Planning guide and also the outline for Retirement Planning Workshops I also felt we needed to assist local RTAs in regard to the financial planner that is indicated in the outline.

I am excited to announce; we have made arrangements to provide the financial planner. IRTA is working with Coffman Wealth Management to make a series of videos covering the topics that will answer questions of educators considering retirement. Videos would explain the two parts of the Teacher Retirement Fund account, as well as other more general issues such as "how much do I need to retire."

The plan is to post these videos on the IRTA website by the end of summer. These videos would then be available on the IRTA website for local RTAs to use at their workshops, alleviating the need to find a local financial planner. By having them available in late summer, local groups could plan Retirement Planning Workshops for fall or winter 2023, which is a good time for those considering retiring. Since the videos will be on the IRTA

website, any educators considering retirement can view these at their leisure or as a follow-up to attending a Retirement Planning Workshop.

The Coffman brothers also suggested we provide information that would be helpful to our members who are already retired. We agreed this would be beneficial in providing information and encouraging people to visit the IRTA website. We are discussing topics for these videos. If you have a question or a topic to suggest, please let Laura or myself know. We want these videos to be useful for our members
